5 Recording the book

Using the most appropriate track display
Complement navigation points and audio
Synchronize during or after recording
Handling various source text formats, such as PDF

6 Checking and cleaning

Ways of listening, such as scrubbing
Add, remove, restore, clean audio
Use free markers for commenting on locations

7 Audio editing

Create and handle tracks and audio regions (blocks)
Create and handle roomtone pauses and fades
Apply equalization, compression, noise reduction
Use Voice Profiles for consistency

8 Assembly and consolidation

Clipboard and Favorites
Handling Cuepoints
Region grouping, selection consolidation

9 Export

Export to audiobook format
Split the audio
Automatic validation and correction to meet publisher standards
Automatic markup, automatic phrase detection
Export to DAISY and ePub formats
Export stereo audio
Have additional WAVE copies
Batch export – a great time saver
Session Cleanup, keeping only the files that matter
